



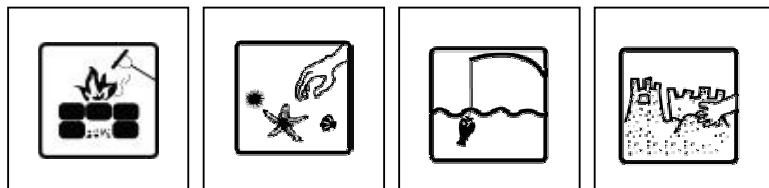

Coral community: starfish, sea cucumber, clown fish, coral fish, crab, jellyfish, sea urchin

Sandy beach: starfish, sea cucumber, clam, crab
